Your audience is the Connecticut General Assembly's Public Health Committee. The committee is Co-Chaired by Senator Terry Gerratana and Representative Jonathan Steinberg. You must decide what group you will be representing in your testimony. Potential options include:

- Local public health department
- Tobacco company
- Teacher
- Smoke shop owner
- Parent

Make clear in your testimony who you are representing and whether you oppose or support the bill. Include relevant background information that supports your position. Remember you are trying to persuade them. Use professional language. Make arguments that will appeal to and are appropriate to your audience – Connecticut legislators who chose to serve on the public health committee. Remember that they are facing a budget crisis and facing reelection later this year. Your testimony will be more effective if you anticipate your opponents' arguments and rebut them. Graphs and other visuals can be helpful, but don't go overboard.
