

Caregivers: Keep Your HUSKY Coverage



Supporting Caregivers. Strengthening Families. Improving Access to Care.



Starting in **2027**, all **HUSKY D** members ages 19-64 must earn money at a job, be a student, in job training, or volunteer in the community to keep coverage.



There are **nine exceptions to the work requirement** such as caring for someone with a disability or an elderly person.



You will have to renew HUSKY coverage **every six months**, instead of every year.



Update your **contact information** with HUSKY for important notices and updates to keep your healthcare.

WHAT'S CHANGING?



New federal rules affect HUSKY D coverage starting in 2027.

- Members will need to meet work, school, job training, or volunteer requirements.
- Some may qualify automatically with the new rule, but others will need to answer questions from the state to keep coverage.

CAREGIVER EXEMPTIONS



You can qualify as a caregiver if you:

- Provide ongoing care for someone who needs help with their health or daily activities.
- The person you care for can be a child, an adult, or an elderly relative or friend.
